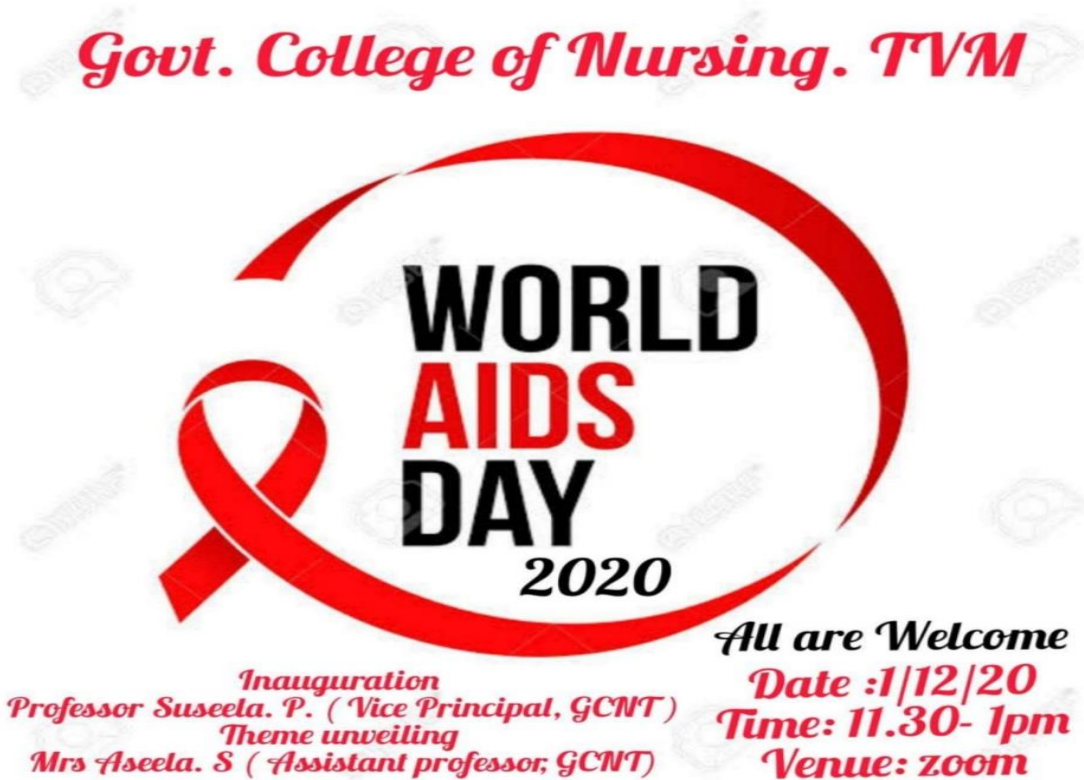
Corona awareness programme

Panel discussion on world AIDS day



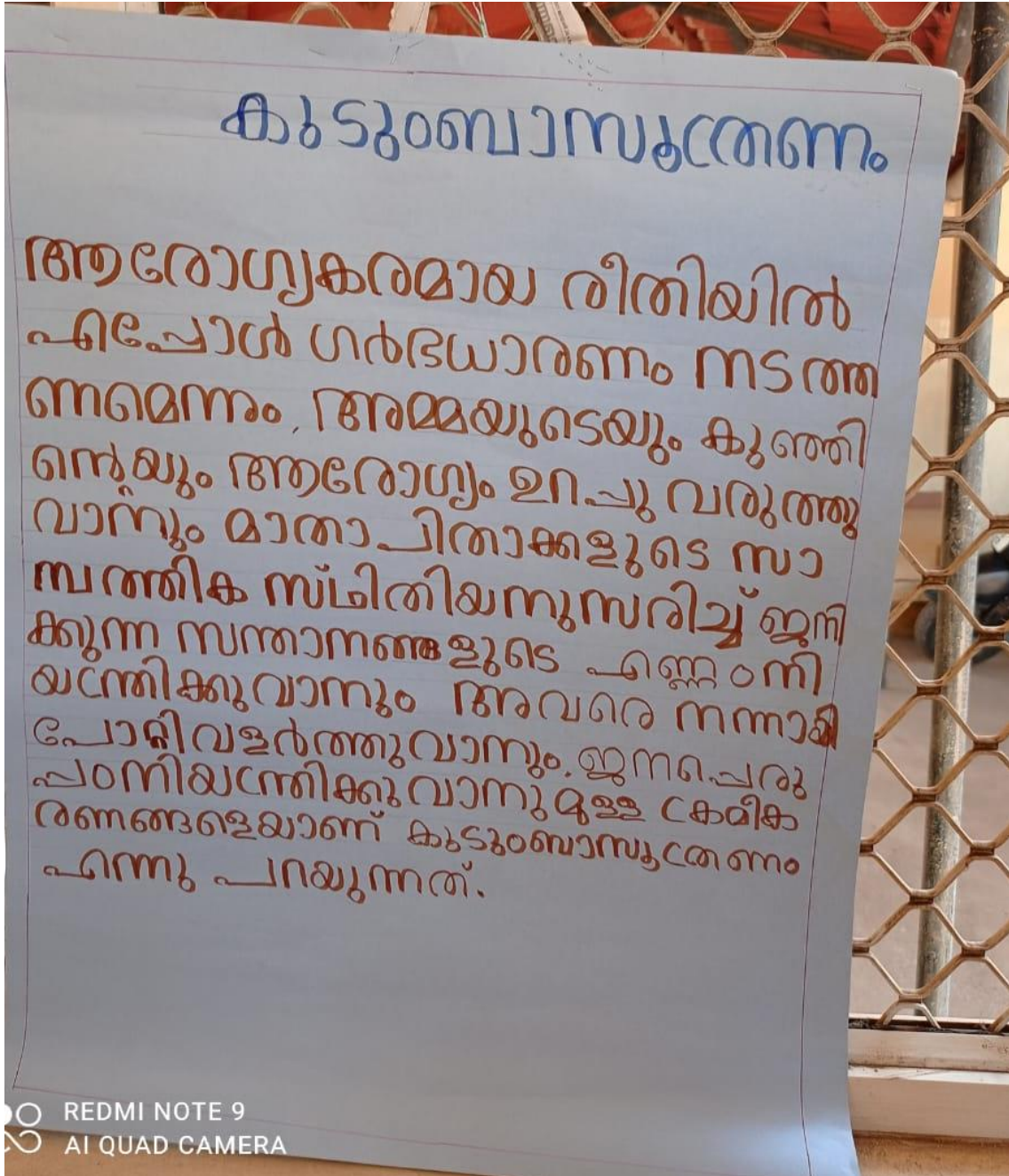
